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#### SUMMARY

During the year 2021-22, Envisions Institute of Development (EID) worked for UNICEF, WHO, Wunderman Thompson, and Association for Rural Advancement through Voluntary Action and Local Involvement (ARAVALI), Rajasthan. These assignments covered a wide range of developmental issues, such as:

- Health Routine Immunization, COVID-19 Vaccination
- Water and Sanitation
- Solid & Liquid Waste Management
- Livelihoods, Self-reliance and Panchayati Raj

#### PARTNERSHIP WITH WORLD HEALTH ORGANISATION

COVID-19 TRAINING KIT FOR FRONTLINE WORKERS

Frontline workers' training kit for COVID-19 was developed. The frontline workers in urban areas were trained with this training material.

#### ANIMATION FILMS FOR COVID-19 VACCINATION

Six animation films were made to tackle vaccine hesitancy and promote vaccine confidence. These films targeted senior citizens, health workers, safai workers, NGO volunteers, and youth.

#### PARTNERSHIP WITH WUNDERMAN THOMPSON

#### COVID-19 VACCINE DESK RESEARCH AND SURVEY

COVID-19 vaccine hesitancy survey was conducted in 8 states at 14 locations, i.e., Haryana – Mewat and Sirsa, Karnataka - Bangalore Urban and Rural, Madhya Pradesh – Dindori and Vidisha, Maharashtra – Aurangabad, Nandurbar and Pune (both city and district), Nagaland – Mon, Uttarakhand – Dehradun, Tamil Nadu – Chennai and Delhi. The findings were used to devise COVID-19 vaccination campaign for these states.

#### PARTNERSHIP WITH UNICEF

The Partnership Cooperation Agreement 2018-2022 continued with 2021 Programme Document (PD) and new PD was signed in February 2022 for the year 2022. Due to lockdown measures and continuing COVID-19 pandemic the focus remained mostly on COVID-19 related work. Major highlights of the work done are given below.

#### COVID-19 FOCUSSED TRAINING & RESEARCH

- Developed risk communication and community engagement (RCCE) training modules adapted from CDC-CERC for mainstreaming of RCCE capacity development at the Government of India's National Institute of Health & Family Welfare (NIHFW)
- Developed a training kit for FLW & others for Ministry of Health & family Welfare, Government of India followed by a COVID-19 updates training kit.
- Second phase of National Centre for Disease Control (NCDC) COVID-19 Appropriate Behaviours/KAS survey planned. Finalised the tool, translated and developed APP in 7 languages - English, Hindi, Punjabi, Marathi, Malayalam, Kannada and Tamil. Completed training of enumerators and NIUA staff, provide support for data collection and management.
- Online trainings materials on COVID-19 vaccination and other issues like stigma conducted in Maharshtra.

- North-Eastern states COVID-19 communication data analysis report was prepared for UNICEF & Meghalaya Waste Pickers' Training Documentation was completed.
- Communication materials' analysis: This interesting analysis of communication materials developed for COVID-19 by various agencies presented a critical review on account of gender balance, communication basics, stages of learning etc., to the decision makers.

#### ENGAGEMENT OF FAITH LEADERS & FAITH BASED ORGANISATIONS FOR SDG

Faith leaders' training on risk communication and community engagement for COVID-19 was carried-out in the states of Maharashtra, and for eight Rajasthan, North-Eastern states in Assam. Post training the faith leaders actively set-up help for COVID-19 desks



vaccination registration. Promotional camps were organized by faith leaders and faith-based organization (FBO).

• Faith leaders and FBO engagement mapping was completed for 14 states. It was used to develop a national faith engagement strategy for UNICEF.

#### WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE

- Provided technical assistance to the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs for development of communication strategy for SBM Urban 2.0.
- Training content for Social & Behaviour Change Communication for Solid & Liquid Waste Management was developed for Government of Rajasthan. Training of state and district officers was completed using it.
